Dear reader,

You may have heard about the Oktoberfest, the Alps, craft beers, Lederhosen and the famous FC Bayern Munich soccer club. Perhaps you have seen pictures of Neuschwanstein Castle or historical towns from the middle ages. This is Bavaria, located in the south of Germany and famous for its traditions and its spectacular landscapes and also as an innovation hub, not only for its automotive, aerospace and other industries but also – and not least - for its film industry. Blue chip companies such as BMW, Audi, Siemens, Allianz and Linde are all headquartered in Bavaria.

Europe, Germany and especially Bavaria offer a rich and diverse landscape with many well-known landmarks. Looking at a map of Europe, you will find Munich right in the center. The Munich metropolitan region is well connected to Berlin and also close to established partnering film production hubs in Europe. Munich airport offers direct flights to the US, many European destinations and also Asia. Other regions of Germany, Austria, Czech Republic, Switzerland and Italy are just a short drive from Munich on the German "Autobahn" and can also be reached via an efficient fast-train network.

Academy awarded ARRI Cameras and Lighting is located in the neighborhood of Constantin Film and the KKR-owned Leonine Studios, and is also no distance from the German headquarters of Disney, Paramount, Amazon Prime and Apple+. Our film universities in Munich and Berlin are almost as famous as their award-winning alumni and professors.

Alfred Hitchcock shot his first movie at Bavaria Studios, which was also the shooting location for Oliver Stone's latest film. We are proud that we have been able to offer crew, services and soundstage capacity to the community of international filmmakers for over 100 years now. This track record of international series and movie production illustrates how well Germany has managed funding schemes over the years to meet standards in international competition. Bavaria offers some of the strongest local incentives in Europe, extending beyond the level of the national German grants system. Work on stepping up the German federal film funding program is already in progress.

Our crew base is firmly established and well connected in Europe. Specialized boutique services complement the huge capacity offered by well-known companies, such as the Bavaria Studios, Studio Babelsberg, MBS and Panavision's local dealer, Ludwig Kamera Rental Group. Recently, the former Air Base Penzing was converted to a large studio, which has already become an established location for hosting shoots of US films and series productions, with some of Europe's leading professionals in cutting-edge virtual production technology and offering a true full-service one-stop shop. An example in this respect is the production "The Empress" which won the International Emmy award and was shot entirely in Bavaria.

Due to the current global climate and energy challenges, sustainable production conditions are coming into focus. Committed to international Green Shooting standards, German production and service companies stand for a new sustainable green deal for the film industry. Our Film Commissions in Germany provide access to those services, as well as location scouting and talent sourcing.

To stress the level of our commitment to the film and entertainment business and its importance for our region, the media sector is now under the umbrella of the Bavarian State Chancellery - the Bavarian Prime minister's office. As the minister of federal affairs and media, I urge you to learn more about our local content, physical production and post-production services, international sales, and distributors. You will find more information on the following pages.

MADE IN GERMANY: EUROPE'S FLOURISHING MEDIA INDUSTRY

What makes Germany to one of the most important business locations in Europe?

With over 700 million consumers, Europe is the richest market in the world. Being Europe's leading and the world's fourth largest economy, Germany is located in the centre of the European Union and offers the largest domestic market with access to all member states of the European Union.

In addition, Germany has one of the highest productivity rates in the world, a continuous market growth and cost-effective production sites. An investor friendly, social market economy provides stable and dependable employment relationships for many decades.

Why is innovation and reliability important in order to provide a stable economy?

Innovation is a major factor of today's economy. Every year, Germany's federal budget provides several billion euros for research and development projects, making Germany one of the largest European inves-tors. Inspite of the grown competition, Germany still is a worldwide leader in innovation, Europe's leading patent applicant and a global player in high-tech solutions. Another plus point: Benefiting from the robust economy, Germany offers quite attractive incentives for domestic and foreign investors. The security for corporate investments is guaranteed by reliable economic and political framework conditions at the highest level. Last but not least: contractual agreements are legally certain and intellectual property is strictly protected.

How has Germany become today's flourishing media location?

The stability of the German economy also enables the media industry to flourish. Germany is a country with an impressive film history and currently has the largest local television market in Europe. During the last years, Germany has established itself as a strong producer of originals and co-productions. German telecommunications companies produce serially TV content, as well. Despite Covid, Germany never stopped promoting and advancing audiovisual content and always takes the next steps preparing the recovery of the creative sector.

Another reason why Germany remains a driving force among the global film and

series production is that the federal and state governments support the film and media industry with a strong funding system. And that has a global impact: more and more German films find their way to the international market. In terms of European film releases in cinemas worldwide, Germany is the sixth most successful exporter.

MADE IN GERMANY: THE CREATIVE INDUSTRY AS A DRIVING FORCE

Creativity and economy - how does that fit together?

Germany has always placed the highest value on creativity and technology: public and private film schools, whose students and graduates have won major international film awards for their work, are spread all over the country.

However, Germany also has an impressive number of prestigious film studios, which are responsible for top-class international film and television productions, including MMC Studios in Cologne, Studio Hamburg, Media City Leipzig, Bavaria Studios and Studio Babelsberg. At the same time, the German film industry focuses on virtual productions as an emerging trend. To give just one example: Penzing Studios near Munich with a special focus on digital and virtual production is currently developing into a worldwide unrivalled film studio.

In order to steadily grow and develop, reliable funding is essential for the German film industry. Creativity, art, culture and economy belong together, they need each other and perfectly complement each other. German federal and state policy sustains the film and media industry with a strong support system and creates real incentives for national and international productions.

In addition to state support such as the German Federal Film Fund and the Federal Government Commissioner for Culture and the Media (BKM), public and private broadcasters support the media industry, as well. With almost 40 million TV households, more than 200 TV channels and a total market volume of over 10 billion euros, Germany is one of the largest and most diversified TV markets worldwide. In addition, many federal states offer financial support and production fundings. The largest funding institutions are located in Munich, Berlin, Stuttgart and Düsseldorf. Together, they have an annual capacity of around 120 million euros.



MADE IN GERMANY: MODERN, HISTORIC AND IDYLLIC AT THE SAME TIME

Great Britain, France or Italy - why might Germany be the best film location in Europe?

Germany offers almost every landscape and backdrop you can think of: fantastic islands and seas, majestic mountains and picturesque valleys, idyllic forest landscapes, rivers and lakes. World famous Hollywood stars like Tom Cruise, Liam Neeson, George Clooney, Oliver Stone and Wes Anderson have filmed in Germany - and would like to do it again.

Either ancient ruins, castles or palaces, even perfectly preserved medieval towns, spiritual churches or monasteries, pristine natural landscapes, backdrops of the Second World War or futuristic architecture: location scouts always find what they are looking for. And although Germany's castles and palaces still are the biggest attraction for international producers, outstanding locations in Frankfurt, Hamburg, Giessen and, of course, Berlin are also used as filming locations for various productions.

Apart from the impressive backdrops - what else speaks for Germany?

With its remarkable film history, Germany simply fulfils all requirements of professional film productions - and exceeds them by far: the highest standards in film technology, modern studios with professionally trained and English-speaking crews and creative minds in all areas and trades are a reliable standard.

The local producers and service providers are not only highly skilled, they also offer first-class services. German VFX Companies such as RiseFX ("Avengers: Endgame"), Trixter ("Black Widow"), ScanlineFX ("Gemini Man"), Mackevision ("Game of Thrones") and BigHugFX ("Ben Hur") are already known for creating high-quality visual effects for the most famous productions, proving once again the quality and visionary creativity of the German film industry.

A LEGACY OF EXCELLENCE

The Academy Awards, or Oscars, have been a pinnacle of achievement in the film industry, celebrating outstanding contributions to cinema from around the world. Germany, known for its rich cinematic history and influential filmmakers, has left an indelible mark on the prestigious awards ceremony.

"All Quiet on the Western Front" (German: "Im Westen nichts Neues") made a powerful impact at the 95th Academy Awards, winning four Oscars, including Best International Feature and Best Cinematography. Directed by Edward Berger and based on Erich Maria Remarque's classic anti-war novel, the film tells the story of Paul Bäumer, an idealistic young German soldier during World War I.

The movie, the third adaptation of Remarque's novel, premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival in 2022, and was later released on Netflix. At the 76th British Academy Film Awards, it received 14 nominations, winning seven, including Best Film. At the 95th Academy Awards, it earned nine nominations and secured four wins: Best International Feature, Best Cinematography, Best Original Score, and Best Production Design. This impressive feat tied "All Quiet on the Western Front" with films like "Fanny and Alexander" (1982), "Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon" (2000), and "Parasite" (2019) as the most-awarded foreign language film in Oscar history.

Over the years, German films, directors, actors, and other industry professionals have garnered recognition and acclaim at the Oscars. The diverse range of categories has seen German involvement in areas such as Best Foreign Language Film, Best Director, Best Cinematography, and beyond.

One of the most noteworthy achievements for German cinema was in the category of Best Foreign Language Film. German films

like "Nowhere in Africa" (2002) and "The Lives of Others" (2006) captivated international audiences and secured the coveted golden statuette. These films not only showcased the talent of German directors and actors but also highlighted the country's ability to tell compelling stories with universal appeal.

German directors have also made a significant impact on the Oscars stage. Filmmakers like Florian Henckel von Donnersmarck, director of "The Lives of Others," and Tom Tykwer, known for "Run Lola Run," have earned nominations and acclaim for their contributions to world cinema. The Oscars have recognized the unique storytelling and visual brilliance that German directors bring to the global film landscape.

In addition to filmmakers, German actors have shone in various acting categories. Performers such as Christoph Waltz, who won Oscars for his roles in Quentin Tarantino's "Inglourious Basterds" (2009) and "Django Unchained" (2012), have demonstrated the versatility and talent of German actors on the international stage.

It is important to note that the success of German cinema at the Oscars is not limited to specific categories. Cinematographers, production designers, and other behind-the-scenes talents have also received recognition, contributing to the overall narrative of German excellence in the film industry.

As the world of cinema continues to evolve, Germany's ongoing presence and success at the Oscars underscore its enduring commitment to storytelling and artistic innovation. German filmmakers and industry professionals are likely to continue leaving an indelible mark on the Oscars, ensuring that their contributions to the global cinematic landscape are celebrated and appreciated.

SUBSIDIES AND FINANCING POSSIBILITIES IN GERMANY NATIONAL AND REGIONAL FILM INCENTIVES

There are numerous and various financing opportunities in Germany, also through German co-productions. Aside from incentives on a national level, a number of regional film funds provide additional support to productions of any budget. Nearly all German federal states provide grant funds and additional soft money depending on local expenditure. More than € 520 million go into national and international film projects every year. The application procedure is basically the same at all regional funds: The most important thing to remember is that you will need a German co-producer.

DFFF I The German Federal Film Fund I focuses on producers of theatrical motion picture: feature, documentary and animated films.




